- Technical assistance for grant writing, code development, and implementation





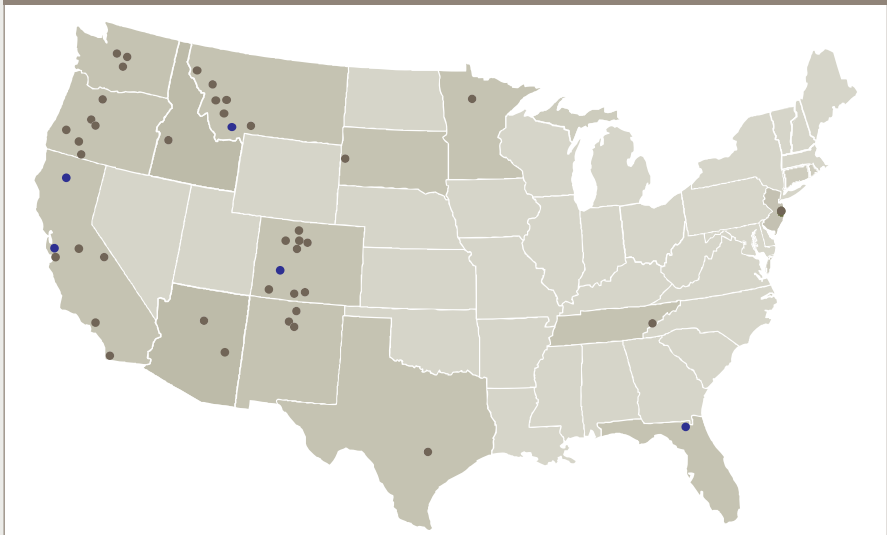

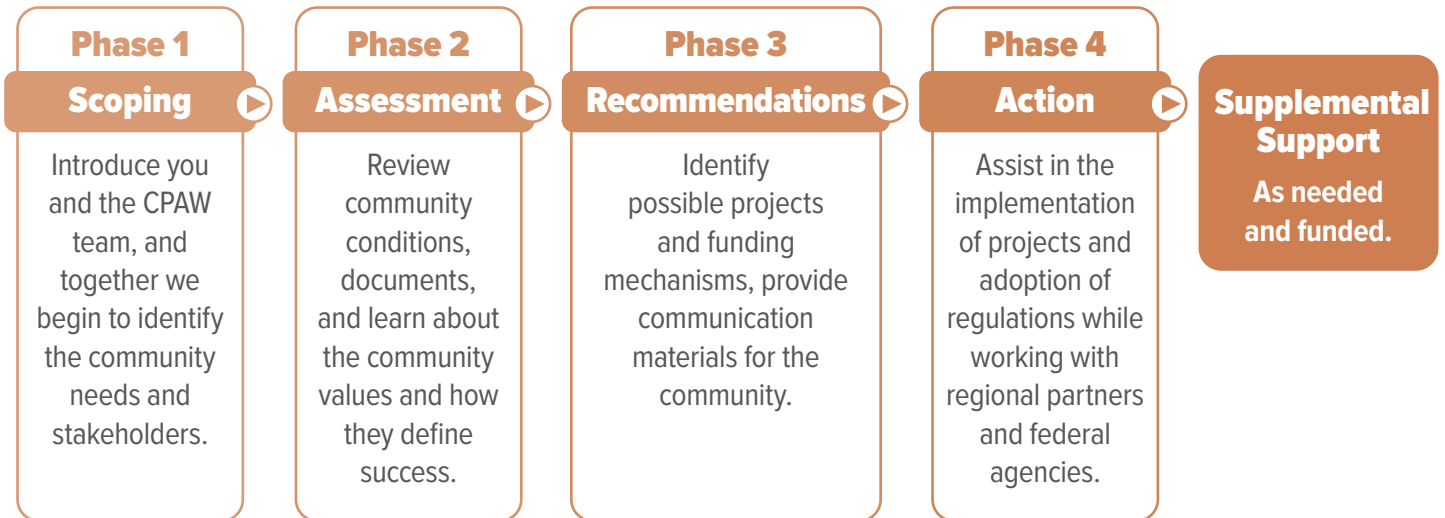
## Where We Work
